By virtue of the powers in me vested by "The Deeds Registration Amendment Act, 1863," I do hereby order that on and after the first day of September next, in lieu of the fees heretofore payable under the Order in Council of the nineteenth April, 1864, in respect of the registration of Grants from the Crown, issued under "The Native Lands Act, 1865," there shall be one uniform fee of fifteen shillings payable on such Grants, and such fee shall be the total charge for the registration, recording and comparing of, and plans delineated upon, any such instrument.
