The postage on letters addressed to the Colonies of Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, and Tasmania, has been reduced from 6d to 3d per half ounce, in accordance with a suggestion originally made by the Government of Victoria. Western Australia has lately also agreed to come under a similar arrangement.

Correspondence has passed between New Zealand and the United Kingdom $vi\hat{a}$ Brindisi since December last, accelerated trains having been established by the Italian Government between the French frontier and Brindisi. The course of post by this route is about one day less than $vi\hat{a}$ Marseilles.
