It is contemplated at an early date to relieve the Chief Postmasters at Wellington and Auckland of the business now performed by them on behalf of the Government Insurance Department. The large proportions which the Insurance business has attained at these offices has made it desirable the change should be made.

The staff of letter carriers at Napier, Christchurch, and Invercargill has been increased by the

addition of a carrier to each office, enabling more frequent and extended deliveries to be arranged.
