INSCRIPTION OF STOCK BY THE BANK OF ENGLAND

(FURTHER PAPERS RELATIVE TO THE PROPOSED).

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 2nd instant, transmitting a Str,copy of a letter, dated 1st May, 1877, which you had addressed to the Colonial Secretary at Wellington, New Zealand, having reference to my minute, dated the 4th of April, 1877, upon the printed papers in the matter of the Inscribed Stocks Bill, for which I have to thank you; and at the same time to express my regret that you should see matter of offence, where certainly none was intended, in the minute which I felt myself compelled to write in my own defence, after what appeared to me the somewhat extraordinary course taken by you.

I trust to be able sufficiently to explain my conduct in the matter to my own Government, and, therefore, content myself with stating that you are, in my opinion, mistaken in your views and statements, and with disclaiming any wish or intention to interrupt the harmony between the two Governments or ourselves—an effect which I cannot help thinking is more likely to be caused by the course taken by you, than by the minute I thought it my duty to write.
