REPORT.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,-

In obedience to the command of His Excellency the Marquis of Normanby, conveyed to me by a Commission dated the 26th day of November, 1878, I do myself the honor to report that I gave due notice of the opening of the Commission at Greymouth on the 4th January, 1879, that I further postponed it till the 11th January, and actually opened it on the 20th January.

It appeared to me that the most convenient form in which the information could appear would be that of a schedule embracing, as far as possible, the various points forming the subject of the inquiry. I accordingly beg to submit the schedule marked A, attached hereto.

With regard to the question of actual partition of the reserves in severalty, I have the honor to state that the Natives interested were not prepared with any such scheme of partition as would in any way be fair or convenient, and I am of opinion that without actual subdivisional plans, which they saw
