HAWKE'S BAY.

As required under clause 102 of the Education Act, the Board of the Hawke's Bay District has the honour to forward a report of its proceedings for the year ended the 31st December, 1884. The constitution of the Board has undergone no change during the year, as the three members who retired by effluxion of time, under section 13 of the Act, were re-elected in March last. The Board held twelve ordinary meetings for the transaction of business. The attendances made by each member were as follows: Mr. J. D. Ormond, M.H.R. (Chairman), 7;* Captain Russell, M.H.R., 6;* Rev. D. Sidey, 9; Mr. Duncan Guy, 8; Mr. Rechab Harding, 10; Mr. Samuel Locke, M.H.R., 2*; Mr. Frederick Sutton, 7; Mr. William White, 5; Mr. J. N. Williams, 7.

The number of school districts is now thirty-five, and the number of schools in active operation at the close of the December quarter was thirty-seven. The teaching staff employed by the Board consists of thirty-seven male and female head teachers, twenty-four male and female assistant teachers, and forty-four pupil-teachers; total 105

teachers, twenty-four male and female assistant teachers, and forty-four pupil-teachers: total, 105.

School Attendance, Napier.—The past year has been marked by a large increase in the number of children attending Board schools, and the increase would have been still larger had it been possible to provide more accommodation for the children seeking admittance to the schools in
