thus leading to economy, and also to the relief of the Board from incessant pressure. case of some localities, the people willingly come forward with considerable sums; but a principle is wanted, such as the necessary contribution of a certain proportion in all cases, which would some-

what control the importunity of some, and secure fair and equitable grants to all.

STAFF.—During the past year, Mr. H. W. Hammond was replaced as Inspector by Mr. W. J. Anderson, M.A., LL.D. The Inspector's report gives full particulars of the work of inspection; and by the results as set forth in the tables, demonstrate that the standard of education in South Canterbury will not compare unfavourably with that in any other district.

The annual pupil-teachers' examination was held in June last, the report of which is hereto appended,* as well as the several schedules giving information concerning the Board's income and expenditure, the names, status, and emoluments of the teachers, the amount of school accommodaexpenditure, the names, status, and emodiments of the teachers, the amount of school accommodation provided, the attendance of pupils, with their ages, standards, and the number receiving instruction in each subject as prescribed by the Act, and a table showing the state of accounts of the various schools as audited by the Board's officers. There are also attached the Board's Regulations for the Employment of Teachers, Regulations for Pupil-teachers, School Fund Regulations, Aided School Regulations, Scholarship Regulations, as well as the scholarship examination papers for the current year.* I have, &c.,
