So soon as he was released from the asylum a surrender of his lease was obtained, and his lease. the reserve relet to a good tenant.

In my report of last year I prognosticated that upon six reserves which fell in during 1884 being relet, there would be a gain to the rental of about £1,400 per annum; the actual gain from the reletting of these reserves has been £1,362 19s. 10d. per annum.
