Return to an Order of the House of Representatives, dated 27th May, 1886.

Ordered, "That a return be laid before this House showing the expenditure in the years 1860, 1865, 1870, 1875, 1880, 1885, on account of salary and allowances to the Governor and maintenance of Government Houses, salaries of Cabinet Ministers, travelling and other expenses of such Ministers, maintaining the ministerial residences, the Legislative Council, the House of Representatives, and each department of the Colonial Government of New Zealand."—(Mr. Barron.)
