CHINESE MARRIAGES WITH EUROPEANS

(RETURN OF) IN THE COLONY.

Return to an Order of the House of Representatives dated 24th July, 1888.

Ordered, "That a return be prepared and laid before this House showing (1) the number of Chinese in the colony who are married to European women; (2) the number of Chinese half-caste children now in the colony; (3) the provincial districts in which such Chinese half-caste children were born and are residing."—(Mr. Seddon.)

RETURN showing the Number of Chinese in the different Provincial Districts of the Colony married to European Women, the Number of Chinese Half-caste Children in New Zealand, and the Birthplaces of such Children, as on the 28th March, 1886, according to the Results of the Census.

In addition to the above 51 there were 41 Chinese returned as "married," without wife or child being shown; but, as many of them were living together, it would appear that the instruction on the schedule had not been properly attended to, and that the number stated cannot be relied upon as married to European women.
