Lowest.—Reading, spelling, writing, dictation; Royal Reader No. V.; composition on stories read; easy letters; grammar without a text-book, and simple parsing. History: Gardiner's History of England, Part I. French: The exercises and rules of Bué's First French Course up to verbs etre and avoir. Arithmetic: Compound rules and reduction of weights and measures. Geography: Geographical terms; easy lessons on chief countries in the world; more special lessons on New Zealand. Science: Easy lessons in botany and physics. Drawing: Elementary freehand. Plain sewing. Gymnastic exercises. Swimming.

3. Scholarships held at the School during Last Quarter of Year. The school gave nineteen scholarships at £15, and three at £12. Sixteen scholarships of the North Canterbury Education Board were held at the school.
