Duty to be levied on Brewers' Caramel.

Onslow, Governor.

In exercise of the powers in me for that purpose vested by "The Customs and Excise Duties Act, 1888," I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby direct that, from and after the date hereof, there shall be levied upon brewers' caramel, used as a substitute for black or roasted malt, a duty of threepence the pound.
