subsection (2) of section 2 of the Act, there is, or was, some reason within the scope of the Act why the claim was not, or is not, effectual. This will, of course, depend on the facts and the particular law in force applicable to the case when the claimant retired from Her Majesty's service.

THE total number of claims received to date is 555. I have personally gone through the whole, resulting in the following:-

Very great difficulty has been experienced in coming to decisions, owing to the absence in so

many instances of records.

In the case of Defence Forces no complete rolls are in existence, and had it not been for the valuable assistance of Mr. Charles J. Wilson, formerly an officer in the corps, the result would have been very incomplete and most unsatisfactory. The same is to be said of the Forest Rangers; but here, fortunately, Mr. W. McGregor Hay, the only surviving officer of that branch of the service, came with his valuable aid, and enabled me, with the assistance of such records as were to be found in the Defence Office, to satisfactorily settle these.

As may be seen, a very large amount of investigation has yet to be done, and it is to be regretted that the numerous calls on my time in my multifarious duties prevent me from devoting so much as I would wish to do. To do the work rapidly and effectively the consideration should be consecutive and uninterrupted, but in my case it is impossible unless equally, in fact much more important work in connection with the settlement of the colony is neglected.

In conclusion, though the books here have been examined to see that the list of claimants now sent forward have not received land, it is possible that land has been acquired in some other part of the colony, so I would ask to have them verified by the records in the head office.
