EXTRACT from a Letter from the Foreign Office to the Colonial Office, dated 9th May, 1890. I am directed by the Marquis of Salisbury to transmit to you, to be laid before Lord Knutsford, and for such action as his Lordship may see fit to take in the matter, a copy of a despatch from Sir Edward Monson reporting that the Greek Government is desirous of obtaining from the Governments of the Australian Colonies a reduction of the duties imposed by them upon dried currants.
