WELLINGTON

I have the honour, on behalf of the School Commissioners for the Wellington Provincial District, to submit, for the information of His Excellency the Governor and the Government, their thirteenth annual report, being that for the year ended the 31st December, 1891. The personnel of the Commissioners has again been altered by the resignation of Mr J W A. Marchant in June last, by which the Commissioners were deprived of the services of a most useful member of the Board. The vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr Marchant has been filled by the appointment of Mr J H. Baker, the Commissioner of Crown Lands. With this exception the personnel of the Commissioners is the same as last year

During the past year the Commissioners paid over to the Education Boards entitled to receive the funds under the 21st section of 'The Education Reserves Act, 1877, the sum of £1,100. During the year also the Commissioners disposed of thirty-eight reserves, at a rental of £300 Cs. 8d.,
