Petitioners, residents of Lake County, pray for a sum of money to construct a road.

No. 34.—Petition of the GREY COUNTY COUNCIL.

Petitioners pray for the refund of £599 8s.

I am directed to report that, as it appears the County of Westland was charged with the proportion of compensation claims payable by the County, and that such charges were subsequently remitted, and the amount which had been recovered was refunded to the County, this Committee recommends that the Grey County be treated in the same way, and that the Government be requested to make provision for the refund of the sum of £599 8s. to the County.

Petition of James Rolleston, Hikurangi, near Whangarei.

Petitioner states that he has lost both time and money in prospecting for coal on Block XVI., Section 2, Hikurangi, and was refused a lease under "The Coal-mines Act, 1886," by the then Commissioner of Crown Lands, Auckland (January, 1891). Petitioner prays for relief.

I am directed to report that the Committee recommend that Mr. James Rolleston be granted a lease under "The Coal-mines Act, 1891," for the prescribed area, and if he declines to accept such

lease the Committee have no further recommendation to make.

## No. 527.—Petition of Messrs. Index and Guffie, Naseby.
