already, and the general appearance of the settlement is such as would lead a visitor to suppose that it had been established for some years. I found in every case that the settlers were contented, and hopeful for the future. It will be seen from the report that there are only two instances, outside of these family holdings, in which no attempt has yet been made to go into residence, viz., Section 19 (McClintock) and Section 28 (Mulholland). Both of these men occupy small blocks of land adjoining the settlement. The gum-tree plantations have been most useful for fencing and shed-building purposes, and in no instance has the leave I have given to cut them been abused. The settlers are, in my opinion, of an exceptionally good class generally, and I think very few, if any, will fail. most of them subdivided. In most cases the houses that have been erected are excellent cottages; in many instances gardens and fruit-trees are to be seen flourishing The result of the year's work must, I think, be considered very satisfactory at a time of depression such as the present. Every section has been securely fenced, and
