in the estimates was 104,500. The fluctuation of the average attendance quarter by quarter is shown by the following statement of working average. March quarter, 104,480, June quarter, 105,214, September quarter, 103,256, December quarter, 107,032.

The proportion between the roll-number and the daily attendance was affected by epidemics in 1893. In 1892 the attendance had reached a higher proportion than in any previous year, and stood at 80.6 per cent. of the roll. In 1893 the percentage declined to 78.5, in 1894 it rose to the former highest level of 80.6. A comparative view of the attendance in the several districts is exhibited in Table B—The increase in the number of pupils is most marked in the North Island, an actual decline appears only in the small districts of Grey and Westland.
