The number of schools carried on in rented rooms is still very large, and so is the number of schools without houses for masters (see Table Q) The number of overcrowded schools shows a slight reduction. At the end of the year eight Boards had balances available for building purposes, amounting in all to £7,025 15s. 3d , the other Boards had liabilities on their building accounts unprovided for to the extent of £6,270 5s.
