3. Work of Highest and Lowest Classes.

Boys.

Highest.—All Junior University Scholarship work in Latin, French, English, mathematics, chemistry, mechanics, botany and German. In the languages no set books are used, but a general review and study of the language, literature, and grammar are attempted.

Lowest.—A continuation class of the Sixth Standard of the primary schools. In this class the study of Latin, French, and mathematics is commenced, with further development on the lines of the work handled in the Sixth Standard.

Girls.

Highest.—English Chaucer's Nonne Prestes Tale, Shakespeare's Richard III., Milton's Paradise Lost, Book I. Pope's Essay on Man, Ep. I. and II. selections from prose writers, 1490–1684 Roman history, to end of Punic Wars, Historical English Grammar, composition, &c. Latin Virgil's Æneid, Book V, 600 ll., Livy, Book XXII., chapters 9–25, Horace, selected odes, at sight Cæsar, Gallic War, Book IV, Composition, Grammar, &c. French Wellington College Reader, Boielle, Poetry Grammar, Composition, &c. German Homann's Deutsche Maerchen and Fouqué's Undine Macmillan's Second Reading-book. Mathematics Arithmetic, the whole subject, algebra, to permutations and combinations, inclusive, geometry—Euclid, Division A, Books I., II., III., IV., VI. trigonometry Division A, Lock's Trigonometry Science Botany, the morphology and physiology of the botanical types specified in the Junior Scholarship schedule, chemistry, the metallic elements, revision of the non-metallic elements. The senior division have revised the whole of Inorganic Chemistry
