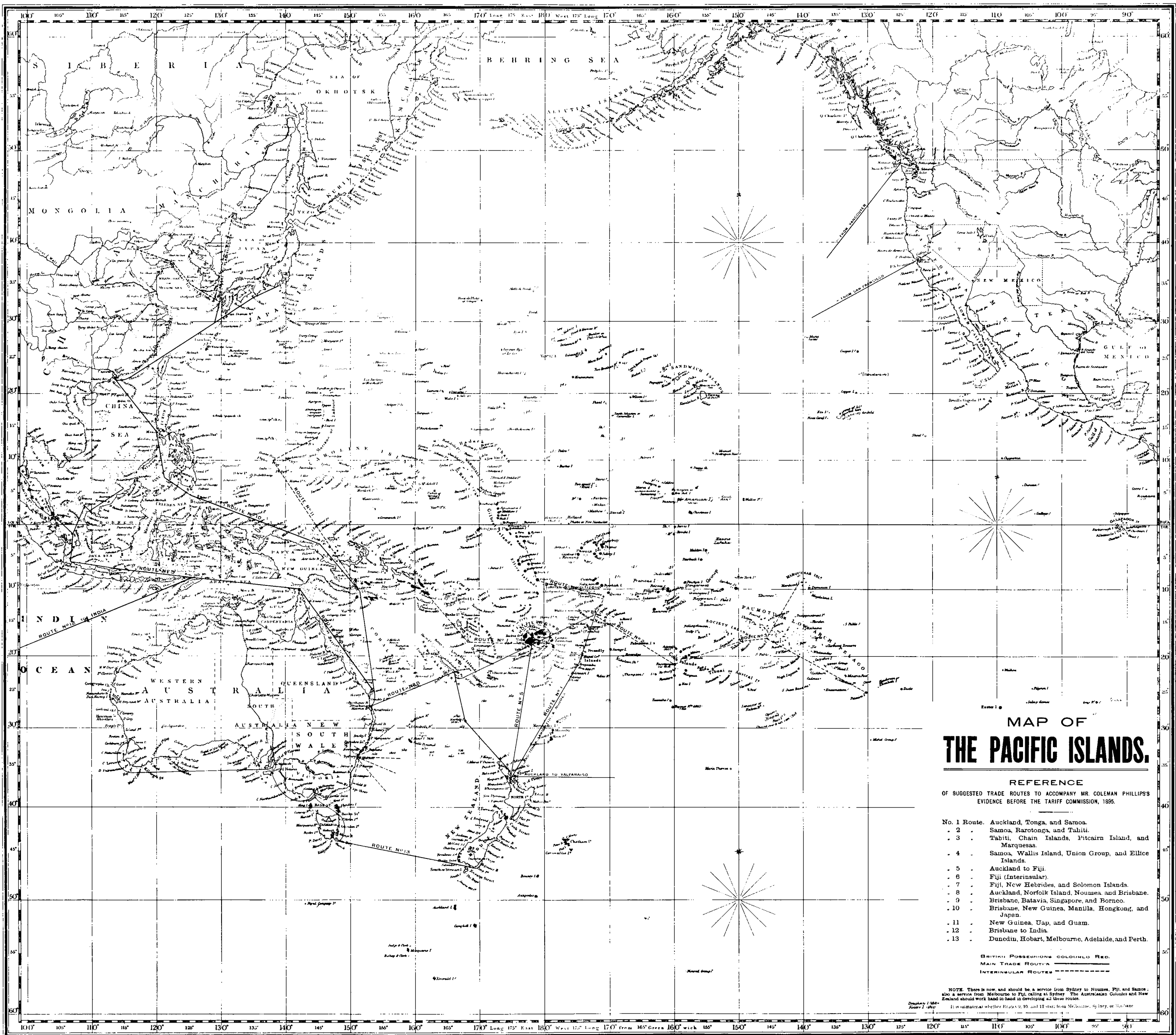




MAP OF THE PACIFIC ISLANDS.

EVIDENCE BEFORE THE TARIFF COMMISSION, 1895.

- No. 1 Route. Auckland, Tonga, and Samoa.
- 2 Samoa, Rarotonga, and Tahiti.
- 3 Tahiti, Chain Islands, Pitcairn Island, and Marquesas.
- 4 Samoa, Wallis Island, Union Group, and Ellice Islands.
- 5 Auckland to Fiji.
- 6 Fiji (Interinsular).
- 7 Fiji, New Hebrides, and Solomon Islands.
- 8 Auckland, Norfolk Island, Noumea, and Brisbane.
- 9 Brisbane, Batavia, Singapore, and Borneo.
- 10 Brisbane, New Guinea, Manila, Hongkong, and Japan.
- 11 New Guinea, Up, and Guam.
- 12 Brisbane to India.
- 13 Dunedin, Hobart, Melbourne, Adelaide, and Perth.

INTERINSULAR ROUTES

NOTE. There is now, and should be, a service from Sydney to Noumea, Fiji, and Samoa; also a service from Melbourne to Fiji, calling at Sydney. The Australasian Colonies and New Zealand should work hand in hand in developing all these routes.
It is immaterial whether Routes 9, 10, and 11 start from Melbourne, Sydney, or Brisbane.

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
