The passes were 56.03 of the number on the roll; the failures were 14.1 per cent. of the number examined in standard classes. The corresponding percentages for 1897 were 55.5 and 15.31. Supposing that the conditions of examination

have been equally rigid, these figures show a general advance.

Table G affords a means of comparing the percentages of passes in the separate standards for the several districts; the comparison must be largely qualified by the fact that the requirements, though nominally the same in all districts, are not actually the same; and, further, by what appears to be true also-namely, that greater attention seems to be paid to the class-subjects in some districts than in others. In Standard I. 97 per cent. of those presented pass; in Standard II., 93.6 per cent.; III., 81.9; IV., 79.1; V., 76.9; VI., 85.6.

Public Schools and Teachers.

During 1898 the number of schools increased by 39—from 1,585 to 1,624 while the average daily attendance in the fourth quarter decreased from 110,523 to 107,904. The mean average number per school in attendance during the fourth quarter was accordingly 66.4, as against 69.7 for 1897.
