COST OF ADMINISTRATION.

Excluding expenditure of £2,556 on capital items, administration costs for the year amounted to £326,195, including £36,140 in respect of the administration of war pensions and allowances. This represents 2.52 per cent. on total payments.

GENERAL.

Under arrangements made with the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific the facilities of the Social Security Department were made available for the payment of allowances to evacuees from Tonga, and as at 31st March, 1942, a total of twenty-five persons were being paid allowances on behalf of the Tongan Government.

The number of officers absent on war service on 31st March, 1942, was 449, 9 of whom have made the supreme sacrifice. The heavy drain on trained personnel owing to war conditions has proved a severe handicap, but the ready response at all times of the remaining members of the staff, together with the temporary assistance engaged, has enabled the Department to function efficiently.

In submitting this report I would like to place on record my appreciation of the staff's wholehearted co-operation in bringing to a successful conclusion a very strenuous and trying year's work.
