\*(ii) Men who had been called up for Territorial service and subsequently called for overseas service were, for a considerable time, not re-examined following the second call-up. This explains the particularly low percentage examined among men called in Ballots Nos. 3, 4, 7, 9, and 12. In the case of Ballot 19, medical examinations were proceeding at 31st March, 1943.

(iii) The above table has been arranged so as to bring out the extremely important effect of age as a factor affecting fitness for nullitary service. The examination of this subject is further pursued in Tables 8(a) and 8(b).
