Amendments of Rules

The rules of forty societies and branches were amended during 1945, five by complete amendment, and thirty-five by partial amendment.

STATISTICS OF MEMBERSHIP AND FUNDS

The number of members of 905 lodges* at the end of 1945 was 83,022, as compared with 85,091 at 1944. This shows a decrease of 2,069, equal to

2.43 per cent., as compared with 3.31 per cent. for 1944.

The total funds of the societies and branches as at 31st December, 1945, amounted to £6,135,413, made up as follows: Sick and Funeral Funds (inclusive of amounts transferred to special funds out of surplus), £5,628,739; Medical and Management Funds, goods, &c., £506,674. Dividing the total funds by the number of members at the end of the year it is found the average capital per member is now £73 18s.
