The Committee, after giving full consideration to the evidence given in support of this petition, is of the opinion that legislation should be introduced to give effect to the prayer of the petition or that some other suitable provision be made for the petitioner.

The Committee therefore recommends that this petition be referred to the Govern-

ment for most favourable consideration.
