REPORT

PROCLAMATIONS issued during the year setting apart land as scenic reserves under the
Scenery Preservation Act in various parts of the Dominion covered a total area of
2,017 acres.

In the Auckland Land District an area of 170 acres of bush land on the lower slopes of
Ngongotaha Mountain was reserved after arrangements had been made for its surrender
from a Crown leasehold. The area adjoins existing reserves on the mountain slopes.
