In an article in the London Sunday Times, Sir Gilbert Campion, giving his impressions of the Parliaments of the British Commonwealth, wrote of the General Assembly Library:—

The block on the right, which survived the fire of 1907, contains a Library which provides one of the best parliamentary services in the world.

Coming from such an authority, this is a very gratifying compliment and one which gives us a reputation to uphold.
