Extracts from the Journals of the House of Representatives

FRIDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF JULY, 1949

Ordered, "That a Select Committee be appointed, consisting of nine members, to consider all matters relating to school-teachers, education, and public instruction generally, training of public-school teachers, higher education, technical education, manual instruction, and such other matters affecting education as may be referred to it: the Committee to consist of Mr. Algie, Mr. Bodkin, the Rev. Mr. Carr, Mr. Freer, Mr. Oram, Mr. Petrie, Mr. Rae, Mr. Wilson, and the Mover."—(Hon. Mr. McCombs.)

THURSDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1949

Ordered, "That the Education Committee have leave to sit during the present sitting of the House."—(Rev. Mr. Carr.)

WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1949

Ordered, "That the Canterbury Agricultural College Amendment Bill be referred to the Education Committee."—(Hon. Mr. McCombs.)
