Visited 19th February and 6th April.—The chief feature of the recent management of this Hospital is the marked tendency to develop beyond reasonable bounds the number of the staff. For an average of about a hundred and forty patients there are three medical men, a dispenser, a house-steward, eleven males—nurses, cooks, and porters—a Matron, forty-five nurses of different grades, and nine female servants (all the laundry-work is done at the Costley Home)—i.e., in all, seventy officers and servants to look after 140 patients. In addition to all this, a majority of the Board seem determined to introduce the strict eight-hour system, and the first fruits of this is a determination to extend the Nurses' Home, towards which the Government the other day have granted a subsidy of £875. If the country can afford to go on at this rate our hospitals will come to bulk much more largely in our annual expenditure. The management of the Hospital apart from this is very satisfactory.
