(21.) The Committee recommend that the law be altered on the lines above indicated, and that the law be so amended that all mining companies should be registered under the Mining Companies Acts.

The question of titles having been extensively dealt with in the evidence, the Committee find that in the case of companies in which the vendors' shares have been allotted the titles are held by the company, but in the other companies the titles are held by the vendors, though the company's money has been spent on them.
