CARGO FOR SOUTH AFRICA

SHIPPED FROM NEW ZEALAND BY "OTARAMA" AND FOUR OTHER STEAMSHIPS
DURING 1901.

Laid on the Table of the House of Representatives by Leave.

LIST of CARGO for SOUTH AFRICA per s.s. "OTARAMA," cleared at Lyttelton on the 12th March, 1901. Called at Cape Town and Durban. Greater part of cargo for Durban.

From Lyttelton.—804 carcasses mutton, 701 carcasses lamb, 662 quarters beef, 200 cases sheep-tongues, 116 cases preserved meats, 14 cases poultry, 553 cases condensed milk, 18,978 sacks oats, 3 sacks and 2 cases sundries.

From Timaru.—189 carcasses mutton, 80 carcasses lamb, 225 cases sheep-tongues.

From Port Chalmers.—9 boxes butter.

From Bluff.—255 cases condensed milk.

LIST of CARGO for SOUTH AFRICA per s.s. "RANGATIRA," cleared at Dunedin in April, 1901. Called at Cape Town, Algoa Bay, and Durban. Greater part of cargo for Cape Town and Durban.

From Lyttelton.—300 carcasses mutton, 200 carcasses lamb, 448 sides pork, 21 cases poultry, 200 boxes butter, 791 sacks bran, 146 sacks oats, 50 sacks oatmeal.

From Timaru.—2,000 sacks oats.

From Dunedin.—1,388 cases preserved meats, 744 cases butter, 90 crates rabbits, 23 crates poultry, 500 sacks barley, 1 package sundries.

From Wellington.—1,000 quarters beef, 200 half-cases pork, 983 boxes butter, 81 cases cheese.

LIST of CARGO for SOUTH AFRICA per s.s. "INDRAMAYO," cleared at Wellington on the 13th June, 1901. Called at Cape Town, East London, and Durban. Greater part of cargo for Cape Town and Durban.

From Lyttelton.—1,200 carcasses sheep, 100 carcasses lamb, 998 quarters beef, 600 sides pork, 82 cases poultry, 250 cases tongues, 33 cases dripping, 450 cases butter, 27 cases whisky, 1,047 cases potatoes, 275 sacks wheat, 5,988 sacks oats, 30 sacks oatmeal, 11 packages sundries.

From Dunedin.—50 cases cheese.

From New Plymouth.—1,087 boxes butter.

From Waitara.—2,035 quarters beef.

From Wellington.—1,790 boxes butter, 285 boxes cheese, 229 cases condensed milk, 8 cases sundries.

LIST of CARGO for SOUTH AFRICA per s.s. "TEKOA," cleared at Lyttelton on the 26th July, 1901. Called at Cape Town, East London, and Durban. Greater part of cargo for Cape Town.

From Lyttelton.—1,048 carcasses mutton, 40 carcasses lamb, 100 cases mutton, 200 cases sheep-tongues, 50 cases preserved meat, 600 sides pork, 3 cases bacon and hams, 5 cases frozen kidneys, 54 cases rabbits, 8 cases hares, 143 cases poultry, 540 boxes butter, 60 cases apples, 11 cases cider, 189 sacks potatoes, 2,423 sacks oats, 10 sacks barley, 886 sacks flour, 200 sacks wheatmeal, 50 sacks pollard.

From Timaru.—1,188 carcasses mutton, 96 quarters beef, 35 cases sheep-tongues, 1,945 sacks potatoes, 5,000 sacks oats, 300 sacks wheat, 555 sacks bran.

From Dunedin.—25 cases poultry, 10 cases whitebait, 70 cases butter, 4 cases sundries, 26 sacks grain.

From Bluff.—4,913 sacks oats, 5 cases rabbits, 5 cases sheep-tongues.

From Wellington.—1,272 boxes butter, 24 crates poultry, 10 cases cheese, 2 cases fish.

From Auckland.—620 quarters beef.

LIST of CARGO for SOUTH AFRICA per s.s. "PAKEHA," cleared at Lyttelton on the 13th September, 1901. Called at Cape Town, East London, and Durban. Cargo chiefly for Cape Town and Durban.

From Lyttelton.—448 sides pork, 200 cases preserved meats, 32 cases poultry, 281 cases butter, 640 cases potatoes, 3,040 sacks oats, 5 cases sundries.

From Timaru.—2,000 sacks oats.

From Dunedin.—1,302 cases preserved meats, 58 crates poultry, 55 crates rabbits.

From Wellington.—70 packages.

From Auckland.—3 cases chairs.
