Association with a considerable margin to spare. The course is intended to follow the syllabus set for the examination of the City and Guilds Institute in electro-technology, and there are at present twenty candidates for the examination to be held in May, 1903. The classes are well attended, and this, the first effort in this district at technical work in this branch, should lead to the establishment of considerable interest in electric science.
