11	To Governor Lord Plunket	(Telegram) New Zea- land (Telegram)	May 12	States that any proposals on fiscal matters which his Prime Minister may wish to bring forward will be submitted to the Conference.
12	To Governors of self-govern- ing colonies	(Telegram)	May 12	Informs them that 15th April, 1907, has been fixed as the date most acceptable to the colonial Premiers, and invites them to attend on that day.
