“SHOPS AND OFFICES ACT, 1904”
(REQUISITIONS RECEIVED UNDER PROVISIONS OF SECTION 21 OF THE).

Return to an Order of the House of Representatives dated the 3rd October, 1906.

Ordered, “That there be laid before this House a return showing the number of requisitions received under the provisions of section 21 of ‘The Shops and Offices Act, 1904,’ giving separately (1) the several districts presenting such requisitions; (2) the trade or trades affected thereby; (3) the hours of closing desired respectively by such trade on each day of the week.”—(Mr. ARNOLD.)

Balclutha ..	Watchmakers, tailors, butchers, plumbers, bootmakers, saddlers, bakers, drapers, general merchants, storekeepers, grocers, cycle agents, nurserymen, and sail and cover makers	6 o'clock on four days of week, 9 o'clock on Saturdays, 1 o'clock on half-holidays, except Christmas and New Year Eves	Dec. 22, 1904.
