ORDERS OF REFERENCE.

Extracts from the Journals of the House of Representatives.

FRIDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1906.

Ordered, "That a Goldfields and Mines Committee, consisting of ten members, be appointed, to whom shall be referred all matters relating to mining and all Bills relating to mines; with power to call for persons and papers; three to be a quorum: the Committee to consist of Mr. Bennet, Mr. Colvin, Mr. W. Fraser, Mr. Herries, Mr. R. McKenzie, Mr. Macpherson, Mr. Poland, Mr. Seddon, Mr. Smith, and the mover."—(Hon. Mr. McGOWAN.)

TUESDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1906.

Ordered, "That the Coal-mines Act 1903 Amendment Bill be referred to the Goldfields and Mines Committee."—(MR. COLVIN.)
