# TRADE WITH SOUTH AFRICA

(RETURN RELATING TO).

UNDER "THE NEW ZEALAND AND SOUTH AFRICAN CUSTOMS DUTIES RECIPROCITY ACT, 1906."

Laid on the Table of the House of Representatives by Leave.

I N exercise of the powers conferred by "The New Zealand and South African Customs Duties Reciprocity Act, 1906," and in order to give full effect to the reciprocal Customs treaty made between New Zealand and the South African colonies and territories following—that is to say, the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, the Colony of Natal, the Orange River Colony, the Transvaal, and Southern Rhodesia—His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that colony, doth hereby declare that, on and after the first day of January, one thoudeclare that, on and after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and seven, the goods specified in the Schedule hereto, being the produce or manufacture of the aforesaid South African colonies or territories shall, on importation from those colonies or territories into New Zealand, be chargeable with the duties and be entitled to the exemptions as specified in that Schedule, and the existing New Zealand tariff is hereby altered accordingly, in so far. but so far only, as is necessary for the purpose of giving effect to this Order in Council.
