LIST OF THE PRIVILEGES AND ENCOURAGEMENTS GIVEN TO VOLUNTEERS AS SUCH UNDER EXISTING REGULATIONS. (August, 1908.)

Accidents ...	<i>Accidents.</i> To men and horses in camp: Compensation allowed	Regulations 403, 403a.
Bands ...	<i>Allowances.</i> £25 per annum special grant, independent of capitation and other payments to garrison and battalion bands. Bands receive a personal payment of 2s. 6d. per man attending such ceremonial parades as the O.C. District may direct	Regulations 370, 381.
Cadets ...	Allowing Cadet corps, where no annual camp held, to hold four daylight parades, at payment of 2s. per member per parade	Regulation 517.
	Allowance of £10 per annum towards lighting expenses and rent of drill-halls of those corps not belonging to colleges or high schools	Regulation 515.
	Capitation for Cadets is 12s. 6d. per efficient per annum	Regulation 514.
	It is now proposed to grant full adult capitation to officers of Cadet corps who pass the examination for their rank and receive substantive commissions.	
	Every efficient member of a Cadet corps receives a free allowance of 100 rounds ball ammunition per annum, and is also allowed to purchase another 100 rounds at 5s. per hundred	Regulation 400.
Camps ...	Allowances to officers for attendance at manœuvres or "manœuvre" camps, provided half strength of corps is present: Lieut.-Colonel, £1 1s. per diem, with forage allowance for horse; Major, 18s.; Surgeon-Captain, 18s.; Captain, 15s.; Lieutenant, 11s.; Adjutant, 3s. 6d. (in addition to pay for his rank); Quartermaster, 13s. 6d.; Staff-Sergeants, 8s.; Sergeants, 6s.; Corporals, 5s.; Trumpeters or Buglers, 4s.; Gunners, Sappers, and Privates, 4s. Ration allowance, 1s. 6d. per day additional. Free railway passes to site of camp, and free transport of baggage, effects, and horses	Regulation 393.
