FOR THE INFORMATION OF HONOURABLE MEMBERS :—

The following cable advice has been received from London this morning :—

The wool-sales have opened with strong competition and large attendance of buyers. There is active demand by all branches of the trade. Prices are $\frac{1}{4}$ d. to $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per pound higher.

Crossbreds, 36s. to 40s., average condition, $6\frac{3}{4}$ d. to 7d.; crossbreds, medium, 44s. to 46s., average condition, $7\frac{1}{4}$ d. to $7\frac{3}{4}$ d.; crossbreds, fine, 50s., average condition, 9d. to $9\frac{3}{4}$ d.

The market is strong for super merinos.
