Ordered, "That there be laid before this House a return showing,—(1) The offences which came before the Invercargill Court, and in respect of which convictions were recorded, (a) for the period of two years immediately preceding the carrying of no-license in Invercargill, and (b) for the period of two years after the coming into operation of no-license in Invercargill; and (2) the number of convictions recorded during the latter period for drunkenness and offences proved to be due to indulgence in intoxicating liquor, and in respect of which the supply of liquor was traceable to sources outside the no-license area of Invercargill."—(Mr. HANAN.)
