- 340. With the exception of the Bills referred to in Standing Orders 339 and 400, a Bill when read a first time shall be ordered to be read a second time on a future day, unless it is on Motion by leave of the House read a first time and referred to a Select Committee.
- 377. When a Bill has passed the House Mr. Speaker signs the same, and the Clerk forthwith certifies the date of its passing at the feet head of the Bill.
- 419 This House will not proceed upon any Petition, Motion, or Bill for granting any money, or for releasing or compounding any sum of money owing to the Crown, but in a Committee of the whole House.
- 432. The Chairman of Committees takes the Chair of the Committee of Supply and of the Committee of Ways and Means. In case of his absence, the Committee elect their House appoints a Chairman.
- 433.—In—ease—any difference should—arise in electing a Chairman, Mr. Speaker—resumes the Chair, and the House appoints a Member to take the Chair of the Committee.
