serious, she is to call in the authorized Government doctor, or take the child to his surgery, on her own responsibility. The foster-parent should be warned that if a Plunket nurse, or a nurse belonging to any other similar organization, is attending the child, that does not relieve her of the responsibility of acting in strict accordance with these directions: and the orders of the doctor must be carefully followed."

The provisions of the Destitute Persons Act will be made use of to recover from the parents what is spent in this way.

EXEMPTIONS.

From the provision that "it shall not be lawful for any person in consideration of any payment or reward to receive or retain in his care or charge any infant for the purpose or nursing or maintaining it apart from its purents or guardians for a longer period than seven consecutive days unless such person is licensed as a foster-parent," the Minister may grant certain exemptions, and under this authority exemption has been granted to the institutions set forth in the following list, which shows also the numbers dealt with and the deaths. The conditions of the exemption provide for inspection, and for removal of the infants only with due formality.
