Bullock, Edward A. H. (M.C. 2469)	Taranaki Volunteers.	This is a case similar to the above. Claimant's name also appears in <i>Taranaki Gazette</i> as having received an allowance in 1872. On being confronted with this fact, applicant denied on oath that he received it, and Magistrate has recommended the claim. There is evidence to show that in 1874 scrip amounting to £12,270 was deposited in the Superintendent's Office, New Plymouth, and the Treasury advise that £7,030 was paid to Mr. Chilton, then Collector of Customs, to redeem the certificates. Though no record can be found giving list of claims settled, there appears to be very little doubt that the Taranaki men received their allowances.	Held that claimant received his scrip under Act of 1865, as set forth in the <i>Taranaki Gazette</i> , 1872, and is therefore not entitled to any further consideration.
Carter, John [(M.C. 2536)	H.M. 40th Regiment.	There is a great doubt as to whether Carter retired for purpose of settling in New Zealand, but he settled at Auckland and has lived there ever since.	Grant of £30 recommended.
Coffey, Denis (M.C. 384A)	H.M. 57th Regiment.	Claimant was discharged at Auckland in 1867—conduct "Good"—and has resided in New Zealand ever since. Saw a good deal of active service.	Ditto.
Collins, John	H.M. 14th Regiment.	Retired from Imperial service before 1872 and settled in New Zealand, where he has resided ever since. Fought in several engagements.	"
Dearlove, Charles (M.C. 499), (deceased)	Colonial Defence Force, Hawke's Bay	Entitled under conditions of enlistment to a grant of land; was lawfully discharged; joined another corps, and was killed in action. Representatives now claiming.	"
Edgecombe, William (M.C. 591A)	Taranaki Volunteers.	This is a similar claim to M.C. 2469, Mr. E. A. H. Bullock, above set forth. Was awarded an allowance under Volunteer Land Act, 1865, but denies having received it. Magistrate recommends.	Held that claimant received allowance under Land Act, 1865, as set forth in <i>Taranaki Gazette</i> , 1872, and is not entitled to further consideration.
Evans, Robert (M.C. 630)	Colonial Defence Force and several other corps	There is no proof of five years' continuous Volunteer service, though claimant saw a good deal of field service, mostly intermittent.	Held that claim is not entitled to consideration.
Fahey, Peter (M.C. 2230), (deceased)	H.M. 65th Regiment.	Claimant was discharged in 1859, and joined Militia, being killed in battle of Waireka. Niece (Mrs. Meachem) is claiming.	Grant of £30 recommended.
Fitzgerald, John (M.C. 665)	Militia	Claimant retired from Imperial service and joined Militia, &c., and has furnished proof as to twelve months' active service against late Queen's enemies.	Grant of £10 recommended.
Focett, Charles (M.C. 2346)	H.M. 14th Regiment.	Discharged from Imperial service in 1868 and has resided in New Zealand ever since. Has had active service.	Grant of £15 recommended.
Hamilton, Michael (deceased), by his sister (M.C. 838)	H.M. 58th Regiment.	Claimant was discharged in 1862, but there is no satisfactory evidence to show that he came direct to New Zealand after discharge to settle.	Held that claimant is not entitled to consideration.
Hanlen, William E. (M.C. 845)	Auckland Volunteers	Claimant had no active service, though the late Major Derrom certifies that he completed five years' continuous Volunteer service.	Ditto.
Harper, Henry (by his son), (M.C. 865)	Wanganui Volunteers	There is doubt as to whether claimant completed five years' service, as Defence Department advise that he had three years and three months. Messrs. Liffiton and Jones both swear, however, that claimant served from 1860 to 1866. He was actively engaged against the Maoris on several occasions, and has claims for consideration for active service.	Grant of £15 recommended.
Hesketh, Charles (M.C. 2368)	Auckland Volunteers	Though claimant completed five years' continuous Volunteer service, he has had no active service.	Held that claimant is not entitled to consideration.
Hooker, Henry (M.C. 2403)	Taranaki Militia	This is another Taranaki claim wherein claimant denies that he received the allowance set opposite his name in the <i>Taranaki Provincial Gazette</i> , 1872.	Held that claimant received allowance under Act of 1865, and is not entitled to further consideration.
Howell, Henry (M.C. 2509)	Taranaki Volunteers.	There is sufficient evidence to show that claimant had about twelve months' active service, during which he was actually engaged against the Maoris.	Grant of £10 recommended.
