TRAINING COLLEGES

(NUMBER OF TEACHERS WHO HAVE BEEN GRANTED TEACHING-CERTIFICATES AFTER PASSING THROUGH THE) FOR THE YEARS 1911 AND 1912, AND THE NUMBER WHO ARE NOW IN THE SERVICE OF THE EDUCATION BOARDS.

Return to an Order of the House of Representatives dated the 12th November, 1913.

Ordered, "That there be laid before this House a Return showing the number of teachers who have been granted teaching certificates after passing through the various training colleges for the years ended 31st December, 1911 and 1912, together with the number of teachers referred to who are now in the service of the various Education Boards."—(Mr. BUDDO.)
