The increase in membership during 1912 was  $2 \cdot 20$  per cent., as compared with  $3 \cdot 67$  per cent. for 1911.

The total funds of the societies and branches as on the 31st December, 1912, amounted to £1,553,339 8s. 3d., made up as follows: Sick and Funeral Funds (inclusive of amounts transferred to special funds out of surplus), £1,436,489 9s. 7d.; Medical and Management Funds, goods, &c., £116,849 18s. 8d. Dividing the total funds by the number of members at the end of the year, it is found the average capital per member is now £21 4s. 2d.
