(4.) The Number afflicted who have been vaccinated, and the Number of Deaths amongst Vaccinated Cases.

Of the 116 Europeans afflicted none had been vaccinated.

It is estimated that at least 85 per cent. of the Maoris were unvaccinated up to the date of the epidemic. So far as is known, no case occurred amongst vaccinated Natives unless vaccinated after the disease was in the incubation stage.

(5.) The State of Surroundings—Hygienic or otherwise—where Cases occurred.

The sanitary state of the surroundings did not appear to affect the severity of the epidemic. The Natives living in comfortable homes appeared to suffer as much as others.
