CLASSIFICATION.

- A.—Men fit for active service beyond the seas.
- B1.—Men fit for active service beyond the seas if they undergo specified medical, surgical, or dental treatment (after operation in camp or public hospital).
- B2.—Men fit for active service beyond the seas if they undergo specified medical, surgical, or dental treatment (after recovery at home).
- C1. Men likely to become fit for active service beyond the seas after special training.
- C2.—Men permanently unfit for active service beyond the seas, but fit for service of some nature in New Zealand in connection with or for the purposes of the present war.
- D.—Men permanently unfit either for active service beyond the seas, or for any service in New Zealand in connection with or for the purposes of the present war.
