The balance is accounted for by quantities of meat then on board steamers loading in New Zealand and losses in the steamers "Clan MacTavish" and "Rotorua."

The important work of inspection, grading, and checking weights, together with the certification of statements furnished with regularity by the freezing companies relating to quantities of meat on hand, killings, &c., is carried out by the Live-stock Division of the Department of Agriculture.

System of Payment for Meat.

The system of payment for the meat adopted at the outset has been adhered to, and has proved satisfactory. The method adopted is for consignors to forward shipping documents and invoices to the Department of Imperial Government Supplies and draw on Wellington, which by an arrangement made with the banks in the Dominion they are able to do without any expense. In the case of freezing companies freezing on account of clients, however, it has been arranged that the company concerned shall forward all documents direct to the Department in Wellington, together with a statement showing to whom payment is desired to be made for specified shipments. thereupon posted directly to the clients named, and are made payable free of This method obviates the necessity for the freezing company furnishing more than one set of documents, and prevents the delay which would arise if a set of documents had to be prepared and forwarded to individual clients and subsequently submitted to the Department in Wellington for settlement.

Payment is made for shipments by the Department usually within twenty-four hours of the receipt of documents.
