EXPENDITURE.

The regular expenditure has been seriously increased by the abnormal rise in the prices of materials that are absolutely necessary for the upkeep of telegraph and other business. The price of iron wire has gone up some 300 per cent.; mechanics' tools, 75 to 100 per cent.;
