Before my departure for England I announced that the surplus for the year 1917–18 amounted to £5,085,934, and I now supply the details showing how the surplus is arrived at. I may explain that the accumulated surpluses at the 31st March, 1917, amounted to £6,474,854, and consequently, after adding the abovenamed surplus for 1917–18, it will be seen that the total surplus at the 31st March, 1918, amounted to £11,560,788.
